## November Council Update - FIRE

### Fire, Rescue, and Emergency Medical Operations

- For the period of 10/1/2013 to 10/31/2013 TCFD responded to 204 emergency calls for service:
  - 133 emergency medical related responses
  - 8 structure fires
  - 9 smoke / odor investigations
  - 15 alarm activation
  - 2 natural gas leaks / power lines down
  - 13 vehicle accidents
  - 2 vehicle fires
  - 1 rescue
  - 21 misc. fire assignments
  
- **Average response time 5:11**
