## **Terre elected to appraisal district board of directors**

THE COLONY, Texas — The Colony City Council member David Terre has been elected to serve on the Denton Central Appraisal District board of directors for 2014-15.

Members of the DCAD board of directors are responsible for hiring the district’s chief appraiser, which is responsible for appraising the value of property within the district.

Terre said it was meaningful to have a representative of the city serving on the DCAD board.

“Every property owning resident of The Colony is affected by property appraisal decisions made by the Denton Central Appraisal District,” he said. “Therefore, I think it’s very important for The Colony to have someone on this board who understands our needs and is looking to do what’s in the best interests of our property owners.

“As a board director, you can be assured that I will attend all meetings and do the necessary research and study prior to each meeting to ensure that I make informed decisions that benefit all property owners in the county.”

City officials believe this is the first time someone from The Colony has been elected to serve on the board.

In October 2013, the Denton Central Appraisal District distributed ballots listing names of individuals nominated to serve on the board of directors to all eligible voting taxing entities in the district. The election took place in December.

According to its website, the mission of the Denton Central Appraisal District is to appraise property for property taxation and maintain 100-percent of market value, allowing local funding for the school districts and ensuring that appraisals are performed in an equal and uniform manner in order that taxpayers pay only their fair share of the property tax burden.
